The School Games Mark is a Government led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including our Sports Crew and children officiating who have made our Intra-house competitions possible.

As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year.

The children and parents dedication to attending staff-led extra-curricular clubs whether that be in the morning or after school. The school car park gets very busy between 7.15am and 9am and also 2.45pm and 3.30pm.
