Nicki Price - JOURNEYS exhibition at Rayleigh Windmill Wednesday 28th June -Wednesday 19th July.

Nicki travelled extensively and described these travels and her impressionist painting as her 'therapy' in managing her emotions during her terminal illness.

Nicki held two London exhibitions but always wished to display her work in her home town, and was proud of her Essex roots

Nicki moved to Rayleigh in 1971, and attended Grove and Fitzwimarc schools.

Nicki wanted to be an artist from a young age starting with painting by numbers, and portraits of family members; and at Fitzwimarc school, teachers (Mr Boygle and Mr Dickens notably) supported her aims and ambitions to make art her passion and career.

After attending Southend, then Barnet Colleges of Art, she became a graphic designer, ultimately setting up her own very successful business.



Nicki continued to develop her artistic style, and sold her work at Bayswater Road every Sunday (except when on one of her numerous JOURNEYS).



On the day of her funeral, unknowingly, the beeb ran the show again, and friends absent from her funeral were able to say their goodbyes watching her on TV. Nicki was diagnosed with breast cancer age 30, and despite the removal of the tumour and medication, sadly at the 5 year mark, Nicki was informed that her cancer was back and incurable.

On receiving this news, Nicki stopped her paid employment and focused on her art and her bucket list - most of which involved JOURNEYS - enabling her, and us, to spend highly memorable times with her travelling the world.

We all managed to get roped into other 'to dos' - Bargain Hunt appearances, with zero knowledge on antiques, being one of them, posh meals out because she truly believed she was posh, and thrill seeking extreme sports or events as she seemingly had a desire for us to expire with her.

As an art student, Nicki frequently visited Highgate Cemetery, and fell in love with its calming, beautiful atmosphere. Nicki bought a family plot upon receiving her terminal diagnosis. Nicki set about designing her own headstone, designed with thoughts as to how the elements would respond to the form and material - forever the artist. The stonemason was regularly visited throughout the making, and quickly understanding Nicki's appreciation of dark humour, said it was rare for him to have such input from the deceased. Highgate is a wonderful place, and we often attended their guided tours - well worth the visit if you can bear the journey and the traffic.

Nicki's greatest ambition was to hold her own exhibition - which she managed to do twice in the last few years of her life with great success; also gaining a place in the Summer Exhibition at The Royal Academy.



Nicki's headstone - not on the guided tour route, but her neighbours include Alexander Litvinenko, Jean Simmons, and a certain Mr G Michael also recently moved in. She would be pleased!

After her death, we have been fortunate enough to enjoy having her art displayed in our homes, but also to have many items wrapped and stored, and it will be hard, yet a pleasure, to unwrap these, display them at the Windmill, and offer them for sale to anyone who loves her art as much as we do.
