Christmas Hamper Donations

On the 1st December is our annual Christmas Fair. Many of you may remember our hamper raffle from last year. Children brought in donations which enabled PAGWPS to create some pretty impressive hampers. Your donations helped us raise nearly £400 on our hamper raffle alone.

To ensure we have a variety of items in our hampers we request that each year group donate items from the list below:

Reception children – Anything Cadbury's
