Attendance-Please Read

Absence from School

It is the school's legal obligation to record all absences from school. On the first day of absence from school, for any reason, a telephone call should be made to the school sick line (01268 743445 option 1) **before 9am** explaining the reason for absence. This **MUST** be followed up by a letter or email explaining the absence to ensure that attendance is accurately measured.

Late Arrivals

If your child arrives late for school, for whatever reason, they must enter via the school office and **MUST** be signed in by a Parent or Carer. We do require **FULL** details explaining the lateness (please avoid writing 'late' or 'doctors ' without further explanation).

With full and correct information for all absences we can ensure that your child's attendance is accurate. With correct absence authorisation codes we can help work towards excellent attendance awards for all.

Administering of Medication Policy

Could we please remind you that the current policy on administering medication in schools states that we **do not administer non-prescription painkillers such as Calpol/Nurofen** other than in very exceptional circumstances once agreed by a member of the SLT. For **prescribed medication**, where possible, parents should request the GP to prescribe medication in a form that can be taken 3 times a day or less and will therefore not be needed in School. To avoid Class disruptions, if prescribed medicines must be given at school, we are only able administer these at the beginning of the lunchtime period. **Please see the full policy which is available on our website.**

Early Years and Childcare

The Essex Short Breaks programme enables children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) and their families to join in with safe, entertaining and interesting activities, while allowing family members/carers the opportunity to have a break from their normal caring routine. They also give children and young people the chance to do fun and different activities to help build their confidence and independence. They are open to all children and young people with SEND who:

- Are aged between 0-18 or 19-25 and in receipt of a personal budget
- Have a diagnosis of special educational needs and/or a disability
- Live within the borders of Essex County Council (excluding Southend and Thurrock as they have their own local offer of short breaks)
